

Sports Premium Report February 2015



Background information

Primary schools receive funding from the government called PE Premium funding. It is allocated to help schools: 'improve the quality of PE and sports activities they offer pupils' DfE guidance.

The DfE guidance states that school's are free to choose the best way of spending the money. Spixworth Infant School have taken a holistic approach to investing the funding in provision which will help children:

- develop a positive attitude towards sport and physical activities
- foster lifelong positive attitudes towards healthy living
- develop the pre-requisite skills and aptitudes in the early years to support the later development of more formal sports skills
- develop sports skills to a proficient level

The money the school has received is as follows:

October 2013 - £5080

April 2014 - £3265

October 2014 - £4894

Total £13, 239

Our Ofsted Inspection in January 2014 highlighted the fact that the school was not spending the Sports Premium quickly enough to benefit the children currently at the school. Specific targets in the School Improvement and Development Plan were put in place to address this. The two targets are as follows:

- Staff to improve the Delivery of PE learning (Curriculum target)
- Staff to improve PE teaching (training target)

The school has therefore spent money in the following ways to address these targets and other priorities for the school.
