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Dear Parents/Carers,

This half term the children's enquiry questions is 'What does light mean to you?' There has already been some fantastic work happening in classrooms from firework pictures to Diwali cards and lots of drama in relation to the Gunpowder Plot. This half term we will also be busy preparing for our Christmas celebrations and our Christmas topic will begin on 8<sup>th</sup> December. You should have already received letters regarding the Christmas plays and the Christmas lunch. # <u>Attendance</u>

Each year the Governors set an attendance target. This year the target is 95.5% attendance. So far we have an average attendance of 97% which is brilliant! You may have noticed that each week we are displaying our attendance figures outside classrooms for your information. We have also introduced weekly class attendance certificates for the class with the best attendance and half termly and termly certificates for individual children. Children will receive one of these certificates if their attendance if above 95.5% as we recognise that most child become ill at some point during the year. In order to achieve our attendance target please try to make doctors and dental appointments outside school hours. We understand that young children, especially those who have recently started school, pick up lots of bugs, but are happy to have children in school who have minor coughs and colds. We do ask that any child who has sickness or diarrhoea does not return to school until 48 hours after the last incident. Children who miss out on only a small amount of school find it difficult to catch up on the work missed and children who miss an average of 1 day per week miss out on half a terms worth of school over a year. Even 1 week a year adds up to nearly half a term of missed learning before they leave Junior School. We look forward to working with you to achieve our attendance target this year.

# Holidays in term time.

As you are aware holidays in term time are now unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are:

- Armed forces personnel returning from a tour of duty
- Police or other service personnel whose leave has been cancelled during school holidays
- Family wedding/funeral.

If you are intending on taking your child out of school on a family holiday please write a letter to myself stating the dates you are requesting to take your child out of school and the reason for your request. Any child who misses 10 consecutive sessions (5 days) or has 10% unauthorised absence in a 6 week period (4  $\frac{1}{2}$  days) will meet the criteria for legal intervention which could be in the form of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

#### <u>Library Van</u>

The Norfolk Library van visits the school every other Wednesday from 3pm-3.30pm. It is free to join and the next visit is on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> November.

#### Coming into school

Well done to all the Year 1 and 2 children who are now coming into school by themselves. It would be great to see some of the Reception children beginning to come into school on their own now that they are settled into their classes and routines.

# <u>Parking</u>

Please could I remind you not to park on the yellow lines around the school at drop off and pick up times and be considerate to our neighbours when finding somewhere to park. Please could I also ask that you also ensure that buses can drive both along Lilian Road and Ivy Road. Parents and carers should not be parking in either our car park or the Junior school car park and should not use either car park as a place to turn around. Parking around both our school and the Junior School is a focus of the local PSCO and Jan Moore will have a heightened presence over the coming weeks to address parking issues.
