This half term we are looking forward to our Flight topic and our trip to Duxford!

Our school topic for this half term is: Flight Our enquiry question is: Which is better at flying: a bee, a kite or a bird?

English

In English we will learn more about our topic through non-fiction books and explore a range of flight related stories. The reception children will continue to develop their letter formation and sentence writing. The year 1 children will be writing series of sentences to develop stories and non-fiction writing. We will also listen to and write summer related poetry.

Maths

This half term we will be learning about 2D and 3D shapes, solving multiplication and division problems and continuing to develop our understanding of number. The children are keen to learn about plane speeds and heights so we will also explore these areas. As always the children will be encouraged to talk about how they have solved a problem.

Topic

Through this topic the children are keen to learn about who invented planes, how they fly and how paper aeroplanes fly. We will be learning about the Wright Brothers and the amazing Amy Johnson, who was the first woman to complete a solo flight from Britain to Australia. What an adventure! We will also be making our own planes using junk modelling resources and paper. The children really enjoyed investigating different ways of making minibeasts move. This time we will be challenging them with axles and wheels!

PE

In PE this half term we will be doing outdoor games. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on a Thursday and Friday. As the weather is improving please make sure your child still has a coat in school every day as we do go outside even in the rain! Please also ensure your child has a sun hat in school and that sun cream has been applied.

This half term we will be learning about Changes; the way we have changed since we started in Oak class and the changes to come.
