We currently have a vacancy on the Governing Body. We are looking for people to join us who have specific skills in one of the following: Law or Buildings. What we do

As governors, we are volunteers drawn from parents, staff and members of the local community. We contribute to the leadership of the school and are involved in setting strategic direction & the formulation of policies. Helping the head teacher and staff to evaluate progress, and setting the school's aims & values are also part of our role. We have an increasing number of statutory responsibilities, such as approving the annual budget and appointing the head teacher.

However we do not become involved in the day to day management of the school – this is the head teacher's responsibility. But we hold the head teacher to account for the performance of the school.

Our role is sometimes described as a 'critical friend'. This means we try to provide independent challenge by asking questions to ensure continuous improvement. It does not mean that we 'criticise' the head teacher or staff.

Being a governor requires time and commitment but is very rewarding.

How we do it

We meet as a full governing body once every half-term to consider a wide range of issues. These include discussions about the school development plan, policies, budgets, admissions, monitoring visits, risk management, and reports from the head teacher - which also includes details of the latest school performance data. We also attend training courses, individually and collectively - and evaluate our effectiveness.

We also carry out monitoring visits that are linked to the school development plan to help us appreciate and understand the workings of the school, as well as ensure the school is developing in the right direction. We do not make judgements about the quality of teaching or the progress of individual children.
