Accidents at school

As you know young children often trip or have bumps. All minor bumps are dealt with in school by one of our First Aid trained members of staff. If an ice-pack was needed or the injury was to the face or head, you will receive a note at the end of the day. If we are in any way concerned about an injury, we will contact you immediately by telephone.

Sometimes young children have wet and messy accidents in school. These are dealt with sensitively and children are assisted with cleaning and changing themselves. Your child will again be given a note at the end of the day detailing the type of accident and how it was dealt with. We ask that you return any washed, spare clothes your child was given to change into as soon as possible. Occasionally, children do not tell a member of staff when they need help. To further support children to share their feelings, each class now has a system in place where children can use images/name tags to show how they feel and when they need support.

Little and often when it comes to homework really does go a long way: 10 minutes reading practise 4 times each week gives your child 8 extra hours of reading each term; 10 minutes phonics practise 3 times each week gives your child 6 extra hours of practise each term; 15 minutes each week sharing a homework pack gives your child 3 extra hours of practise each term. If you feel you need any support or advice with homework, please do speak to your child's class teacher.
