<u>Staffing</u>

Planetarium Visit

To enhance our Space topic, on Friday 13th January, Immersive-Theatres will be bringing one of their inflatable, projection domes to our school. <u>Mathseeds</u>

Our home/school links supporting English (through Pobble) and Computing (through Purple Mash) have been hugely popular with many of our children and are enabling families to get more involved with their children's learning in a fun and accessible way. After significant research and evaluation, we are now able to offer home access to Mathseeds – a fantastic app for practising and developing Maths skills at home. Age inappropriate computer games and <u>films</u>

It has come to our attention that several children appear to have an in depth knowledge of characters and events in computer games and films rated 12, 15 or 18. Some children have been roleplaying events and talking about these games/films at play times which has led to rough play in some instances and other children becoming upset or worried. In line with our duty to safeguard children, if a child talks about playing or having access to such games and films then in addition to informing you we will have to refer the incident to Children's Services.

<u>Parking</u>

Safe and considerate parking is always a priority around our school. We thank you for not parking on the yellow markings or in the Junior School or resident's car park opposite our school.

Can I also clarify that parking in our car park is for staff only at all times. This includes when picking up children at the end of their after school clubs. It is essential that emergency vehicles can have clear and direct access to the school at all times. Thank you for your understanding.

Governor's Decision on Younger Siblings Attending Cafes

The Governors of Spixworth Infant School are always keen to hear your feedback and regularly review their decisions in light of this. Following a small number of requests for younger siblings, including babies, to be able to attend cafes the Governors have decided to maintain the current procedures in this case. The main reasons for this decision are: to ensure the school children and their learning remains the priority and to ensure the health and safety of younger siblings (resources used are not always suitable for younger children/tripping hazards for mother's carrying babies).
