The Colourometer is a tool we are now using as part of our Child Whispering work. The dial turns between red and green. It can be used to help children recognise and represent their feelings. We are learning ways to deal with our feelings and what steps can be taken to move towards green. The Colourmeters can also be used to talk about choices and decisions. After only a few weeks, we are already beginning to build our skills!
