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

Year 2 Special Work (SATs)



Throughout May, all Year 2 children across the country will be completing statutory assessments (SATs). The results from these assessments are used to inform how teachers grade a child's overall achievements in English and Maths at the end of Year 2. We aim for every child to be able to do their best in these assessments but recognise that children learn at different rates. While most children will meet the government's expected standard at this time, others will exceed this and others will not meet this standard yet. For all children, please read regularly, complete other homework tasks set, promote sleep, a healthy active life-style and avoid placing pressure on children. <u> Planning Ahead - Visits</u>



You will shortly be receiving a letter regarding a visit for the children in June linked to our next topic, 'Journeys.'

The Year 1 and 2 children will be visiting Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse Museum on Monday 18th June.

The Reception children will be spending the day at Catton Park and Haymen Lodge on Tuesday 19th June. Both groups of children will be completing activities that link English with our topic at a level appropriate for their different ages.

Year 1 Special work (Phonic Screening)

During the week beginning 11th June, all Year 1 children (and those children in Year 2 who did not pass the phonics fape check in Year 1) will be taking their phonic screening check. The children will be asked to read 40 words with a teacher. Some of the words are real while others are made-up words. This makes sure that only phonic skills, not sight reading skills, are checked. Please help your child by reading regularly and practising with the phonic card sheets that are sent home weekly.
