Our school topic for this half term is: Dream Big
Our enquiry question is: How big is a dream?

English

We will be exploring repetition in order to write simple sentences, by looking at patterned language in *Funnybones* by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. In non-fiction we will be exploring the structure of instructions and will be linking this to our self-portraits. Poetry will link to the senses and the children will learn to create and recite a simple poem.

We will visit the library on Thursdays to allow children to select from a wide range of genres.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will be consolidating our understanding of place value and using this to explore and consolidate our use of number. We will also be practising counting, ordering and writing numbers. We will also revisit addition and subtraction as well as multiplication and division. Year 1 will focus on doubling and halving. Year 2 will extend upon previous learning in Year 1.

Our school continues to subscribe to Mathseeds which offers fun activities to consolidate Maths

Learning Across the Curriculum

Our topic will take a history focus. We will investigate changes that have occurred during the children's lifetime, including development of skills and recent inventions. We will also learn about Grace Hopper as an inspirational person. In Science, we will investigate the human body and also look at how humans and animals adapt for different environments. As part of our topic, Dream Big, we would like our children to find out all about the different jobs they could aspire to do when they grow up. In order to make this a success, we need to have as many different careers showcased as possible. This will take the format of a careers fair in which children move around asking questions about the jobs that interest them.
