Free Lunches

This year, the Government are still providing a free lunch to all infant children. Our Universal Infant Free School Meals include the choice of a meat or vegetarian hot meal, jacket potatoes or a school packed lunch. Special diets can usually be catered for on request. Please be aware that our production kitchen and dining hall are nut free zones. If you do choose to provide a packed lunch from home, nuts or food containing nuts must not be included. Fizzy drinks are also not allowed.





Core Values and Behaviour

Our School Core Values of **Safety**, **Teamwork**, **Achievement**, **Respect and Stimulation** are central to all we do. Within school children earn house points for showing the Core Values. As part of our Friday celebration assembly two children from each class can also earn a certificate for their commitment to our Values.

We also use traffic lights for recognising behaviour. Children have the chance to improve their behaviour if they move onto amber or red and are rewarded for behaviours that see them move to silver or gold. <u>Tapestry</u>

Tapestry is used at Spixworth with all year groups to record the experiences and achievements of your children. If you have not yet received your login information this will be with you very soon. Enrichment

Each term our children have the opportunity to experience learning that goes beyond the National Curriculum. This year we are offering Forest School and Mandarin every term with Mindfulness, First Aid and African Drumming added for the Autumn term. Every Wednesday afternoon the children will take part in three sessions. The sessions will change at half term, so all children experience all activities by Christmas.

All login information for Reception children are on their way. Those children that made regular use of these at home last year made better progress at school than those children that did not. Please get involved and enjoy learning together.



Safety Reminders

- Only certain members of staff are allowed to let visitors into the school
- If you come into school you will be asked to sign in and out at the office
- Unless otherwise informed, push chairs should normally be left outside school in the buggy park or in the entrance
- Children should not be on the play equipment or their own bikes/scooters before or after school

General Reminders

- Please park considerately. Doing so makes our school and the surrounding area safer for everyone. The school car park is for staff only. The car park opposite is for residents only.
- We are outside in most weathers. Please make sure your child has a named coat, wellies, sunhat and water bottle in school every day.

- If any of your details or circumstances have changed over the holiday, please let us know so our records are kept up-to-date.

Attendance

We all want our children to achieve the best they can and have every opportunity in the future to follow their dreams. School attendance (and not just at junior or high school, but at infant school too) makes a real difference to how confident and capable our children become. Put bluntly, missed school means missed learning and missed learning cannot always be caught up on quickly or fully meaning your child will achieve less than their potential. Of course illness cannot be helped, but additional absence (e.g. for holidays) is detrimental. Our school target for overall attendance is 96%. I will keep you updated as to how well we achieve this each month, but this target is not for our benefit, it is for the children's and also for yours. Did you know that it is an illegal offence to take your child out of school in term time? Doing so could lead to a fine and ultimately a criminal record that would be disclosed on a DBS check and could therefore affect your applications to certain jobs. Children are only in school for 190 days per year and education is important. Wherever possible, please book holidays outside of school time. The agenda item for our first Parent Forum, on Wednesday 7th November will be Attendance. Please come along if you have questions or would like to discuss attendance further.
