Younger Siblings in school

Here at Spixworth Infant School, we want to make sure all families have the best opportunity to share in their child/ren's learning and so, the diary for the next academic year is sent out in July, before the school breaks up for summer. This gives everyone equal opportunity to either arrange time off work or childcare arrangements well in advance. Very occasionally events are added to the diary and we always ensure these are communicated to you, either via the head teacher's or class newsletters or informed to you by letter at the earliest opportunity.

Younger siblings are welcome at our class assemblies and performances, sharing afternoons, parent forums, parent/teacher progress meetings and Christmas cafes. We do however ask that alternative childcare arrangements are made for the reading/writing/math's cafe's which take place once a term.

These cafe's are part of your child's structured learning for that day and will take the place of either their English or Maths lesson. They are intended for you as parents/carers to be actively involved in your child's learning at school and see the many, varied ways we help our children to learn here at Spixworth Infant School. They will also provide you with resources to use with your child/ren when continuing their learning at home.

We also need to ensure we keep our children and all visitors safe. The reading/writing/math's cafe's take place in year groups, which means the hall, when set up for learning, can become very crowded. We also have resources, such as scissors and glue within easy reach for our learners. Due to health and safety regulations, we can not allow pushchairs into the premises during school hours. So, as you can see, allowing younger siblings to attend these cafe's would significantly increase the risk of accident or injury.

As volunteers and all of us working parents ourselves, we fully understand that it is not always possible to attend school events and so, when you are not able to attend, we welcome grandparents, aunts, uncles or other family members to attend in your place.
