Our school topic for this half term is: Super You, Super Me Our enquiry question is: Who were the superheroes of the past?

English

This half term we will be focussing on Traction Man by Mini Grey. We will investigate character emotions and actions and think about the idea of plot. We will use this to write our own adventure story. Our focus will be saying out loud what we are going to write and then using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

Our non-fiction text will be writing a report on sailing around the world. This will link in with our history topic, studying Nelson. We will focus on presentation and letter formation.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will be looking at place value (tens and ones) and learning, for example, that 16 is 10 and 6 more not 1 and 6 more. We will also revisit addition and subtraction challenging ourselves with larger numbers and problem solving. We will begin to explore measurements such as capacity, weight, length and height.

We will continue to practise counting forward and back to 100 starting from different numbers and begin to think about counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Learning Across the Curriculum

Our topic will take a History focus. We will investigate the life of Horatio Nelson and compare his sailing adventures with the modern day adventures of Ellen McArthur. Within this we will make links to the local history of Lord Nelson. Our Science focus will be on materials. We will look at which materials are used to make different objects and discuss the properties of these materials. To enhance this the children will investigate making a boat for Nelson, thinking about floating and sinking, waterproofing and what material would make a good sail. In

computing we will practise logging onto a laptop and opening a variety of text and paint programs. All activities will link to our topic. In music we will be investigating the song 'Row, row, row, the boat' including adding instruments, creating notation and singing in a round.


