


Headteachers' Bulletin

Spixworth Infant School

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Welcome back to the second half of the Spring term where our whole school topic is Food, Glorious Food. We have a fun-filled half term planned as usual with many exciting additions to our school days. Book day and Science week are both this half term, we have a visit out to the farm and also visitors in school including a martial art taster session, an oral hygienist workshop and a road safety magic show. Introducing: Willow Room

The governors and I are extremely proud to introduce Willow Room. We believe whole-heartedly in our school ethos of educating the whole child and meeting the individual needs of each unique learner. We respect that for some children to be able to excel in Maths and English learning, they may first need to meet speech and language targets or address sensory or attention needs for example. Willow Room enables us to do just that.

Some children (whose parents have already been included in conversations) will be able to have specific activities, led by experienced and trained staff, in Willow Room. The room itself has been designed carefully to meet this purpose and each activity is designed especially for each child's own next steps. Some children will access several sessions per day in Willow Room, while others may have only one or two sessions per week. As children complete their sessions and meet their targets, opportunities will arise for other children to access this dedicated support. Should your child be considered for support in Willow Room, Ms Davies (SENDCo) will contact you first.

Many, often larger, schools are able to offer this level of support to their children. We are thrilled to have prioritised this support for the children of Spixworth Infant School and look forward to seeing how such a personalised approach will enable even more children to shine.
