Learning Across the Curriculum

This terms topic will be Food Glorious Food. Where does our food come from and is it farmed, caught or grown? Children will be learning the importance of a healthy diet and during the half term we will have the opportunity to visit Norton's Dairy to experience where and how milk is produced, learning about young cattle and the kinds of crops that grow on the farm.

In geography we will be discovering where our every day food comes from by comparing food sourced locally, within the UK and also globally. In RE we will be learning about the significance of Easter in the Christian faith and Passover in Judaism.

In computing we will be focusing on e-safety and how to store and retrieve information electronically. In science we will be looking at food chains, healthy eating and linking this to where food comes from.
