We will continue to focus on improving our spellings this half term. By the end of Year 1 the national expectation of spellings is to accurately spell the days of the week and to spell most of the common exception words.

Our school topic for this half term is: Magical Monsters Our enquiry question is: Where are the wild things?

English

In English, we will be reading 'Tadpole's Promise', we will explore the story through drama, story maps and finish with writing our own version of the story. We will then move on to looking closely at non-fiction texts and write our own non-fiction booklets.

Reception children will also continue to develop their writing skills through story scribes and immersive writing in our indoor and outdoor environment.

Maths

In Maths, we will continue to learn about the different strategies that can be used for addition and subtraction. Through our 8 week project we will explore how we can demonstrate addition and subtraction using different objects. We will also be exploring place value to 100 using money, weight and capacity as contexts. We will also continue to develop our understanding of number and talk about how to solve problems to develop our fluency and reasoning skills.

Learning Across the Curriculum

This half term we will be finding out about Magical Monsters – from a tiny caterpillar to a gigantic elephant! We will learn songs about animals in music, find out about animals around the world in geography and study animal artwork in Art sessions including Matisse's The Snail. In Science, we will be taking a closer look at animals by studying the families they belong to and begin to identify animals by where they live and what they eat.




