Summer Term Monitoring

Governor monitoring takes place in school throughput the whole year, we speak to school leaders, staff, collect parent views through surveys and forums, carry out learning walks, consider the finances, review policies and much more.

We always try to hear from as many different stakeholders as possible. Possibly one of the most important stakeholders we hear from however are the children themselves. At the end of the year, all the children complete a pupil survey but this term, governors have spoken to the children about specific areas of school life. Here's what they had to say:

PE & Sports

Q: Do you think the profile of PE & Sports has been raised this year?

"I think yes because we are going to do more exercise, running with the water fight and the gymnastics trip. Also we have got some new equipment like the tennis and the trim trail." (Yr2 girl)

"Yes because we have done big learning in PE." (Yr 2 boy)

Q: What do you do for physical activity each day?

"We do PE and daily mile and break and lunch because we go on the wiggle cars and can play tennis. Even the trim trail is exercise" (Yr2 girl)

"I play 'IT' and we do PE and football club." (Yr1 boy)

"Running and jogging in PE, lunch time I go on the wiggle cars and pay hide and seek. At home jumping on the trampoline." (YrR girl)

Personal Development, Behaviour and Welfare

What is child whispering?

"What someone is feeling, we have to respect them if not that would be mean." "It is about telling people how you feel and letting your feelings go instead of keeping them in." "Child whispering is being kind with what you say."

When do you do child whispering?

"In learning circles." "I think we do child whispering all the time, because you can always say stop, think, choose."

What are learning circles?

"Learning circles are when people from different classes come together and sit in a circle and we do an activity linked in with our core values." "Some children can make friendships in learning circles, which is very important."

What are the core values?

"Safety, respect, achievement, teamwork and stimulating." "If you put them in order it spells 'stars', we should all be proud of what we do."

Why are they important?

"If we did not have core values in our school, it would not be a nice place." "The core values bring us together."
