Our school topic for this term is: Bright Lights, Big City

Bright Lights, Big City Part 2!

This half term we will be learning about the past through the history of The Great Fire of London. We will be making fire themed pictures using different textures in Art, practise singing the song *London's burning* in Music using instruments and will be learning about the Geography of London compared to the rest of the UK.

The children will also be involved in designing and making models of Tudor houses in Design Technology, whilst comparing how news would have travelled in the past compared to our technology now. In English we will be exploring poetry, telling stories in first person and writing short diary entries. In Maths we will be continuing a number focus per day in Reception and working on addition and subtraction in Year 1.

The whole school project this half term is handwriting. We are using the handwriting ditties to help us form our letters correctly. Here are examples of expected letter formation for Autumn Term.

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
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
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
