It is with sadness that I must also report that Miss Gowing has had to leave us due to on-going health reasons. We will be appointing a new teaching assistant shortly.



This year, schools will again receive money from the government that can only be spent on improving children's healthy lifestyles and physical well-being. The governors and I have agreed how this money will be spent at Spixworth Infant School. As well as continuing to support our cookery room and early morning club, our main aim this year is to provide greater all weather access to outdoor play and learning for all year groups, through the addition of a canopy on part of the main playground. A few parents had mentioned a need for this two years ago, when the Reception area received their canopy - we are very pleased to now be able to provide this. Pupil Premium Funding

Pupil Premium is paid to schools that support children of families in receipt of some benefits. This money should support individual children but also positively impact on these children within groups or classes – meaning all children benefit. As with any additional money provided to schools, how this is spent must be reported. At Spixworth Infant School we provide after school clubs and trips free of charge to children who receive Pupil Premium. We also provide small group support linked to specific areas of need, training for staff to support specific needs and whole school approaches. This year, emotional literacy, Lego therapy and speech and language training take priority. If you think your child may be entitled to Pupil Premium, please ask at the office for more information.
