What is the role of the SENCO?

The SENDCO works with pupils, parents/carers, staff and outside agencies to support pupils who have needs relating to:

Communication and Interaction Cognition and Learning Social, Emotional, Mental Health Sensory and/or Physical Needs

How do our schools identify and assess children with SEND?

We liaise with Parents /carers.
We talk to school staff.
We use school-based assessments.
We work with outside agencies such as Health and Educational Psychologists.
