

Remote learning protocol



Children should:	Teachers will:	Parents should:
 Wear suitable clothing, as should anyone else in your home. Dress like you would for non-uniform day – no pyjamas! Have a quiet suitable place to work. Please be aware of what is in the background. Know where the adults are in the house so they can ask for support as required. Be polite, as they would in face-to-face conversations with teachers or their peers. Follow teacher instructions around online expectations. For example, screen sharing, mute function and using options such as raise 'hand' NOT record or screen capture content from a video call. 	 Provide remote learning, including some live lessons or recordings. Manage meetings, and will remain in the meeting at all times. Make expectations and learning behaviours clear. Have the right to remove a pupil from a live session if behaviour expectations are not being met. Ensure no one else is on view from the camera, and wear suitable and appropriate clothing. Only hold live lessons during the school day. Ensure that any tabs they have open are appropriate for a child to see, if they are sharing their screen. Use professional language. Offer recordings where possible. Keep a log of who is engaging. 	 Make sure your child accesses as much home learning as possible. Ensure your child follows the correct protocols when online Be aware of the home learning available, by regularly checking Tapestry (SIS) or Google Classrooms (WVJS) Make sure that your child is ready for live lessons or meetings so meetings are not delayed and you are not locked out. Ensure your child is appropriately dressed for meetings or Tapestry observations. Ensure other family members are appropriately dressed and out of camera shot. Discuss with your child the appropriate way to behave in live meetings NOT film the session on another devices, this is a safeguarding and GDPR issue.
