The visual and verbal messages children gain from books (and other media) influence their ideas about themselves and others. Books can reinforce (or undermine) children's views about themselves, teach accurate (or misleading) information and foster positive (or negative) attitudes. Length of the School Day

Some of you may have read or heard about the Government's recent White Paper for Education. Within this it is clarified that **every** school **must** be open for 32.5 hours per week. This is 6.5 hours per day. To ensure our schools are meeting this requirement and providing the full offer to our families, from September we will be making some small changes to our start and finish times.



We are currently consulting with staff as some contracts need to be amended to accommodate this change. From September, we expect our times will be as detailed in the table below. We will confirm these times within two weeks.


Wishes and Feelings
