### Phonics (Little Wandle)

We have been developing our letter formation and sound knowledge. This half term we will be reviewing and embedding our sounds s, a, t, p, I, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, h, b, l, f and ck before learning some new sounds and tricky words. We will continue to build confidence with sounding and blending when reading CV/VC and CVC words.

### Mathematics (Mastering Number)

We have been continuing our mastering number learning by exploring subitising, comparison, composition, counting, cardinality and ordinality.

We have used the songs '1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive' and '5 Peas in a Pea Pod Press' to help us learn about the composition of 5. We learnt about more and fewer looking at different quantities. We have used a range of manipulatives and resources when exploring all areas of our number learning.

<u>Coming Up:</u> Following our night time adventure we will be exploring the story of the owl babies, we will continue our funky fingers work with dough disco and fine motor activities, explore Christmas traditions around the world, spot seasonal changes, sing songs and rhymes, investigate percussion instruments, construct with different materials and further explore Jackson Pollock inspired work and winter art.
